Sermon Title: The Revelation of Jesus Christ: A gift from the Father

Scripture Reading: Revelation 1:1-13

- 1. The Gift of Revelation: vs 1—James 1:17/John 3:27-35
  - a. "From the Father to the Son"
    - -John 5:20-23; 13:3/Mt 11:25-27
  - b. The Reward of His obedience and conquest
    - -Ps 2:7-8/Phil 2:9-11
  - c. A witness and a saving revelation to the Church
    - -Eph 1:15-23/Luke 1:31-33
- 2. The Immediacy of the prophecy: vs 1c, 3c "The future is now"
  - a. We reject a purely futuristic view Mt 24:9-14
  - b. The Revelation is: historic, contemporaneous, progressive Rev 1:4, 8, 18; 4:8; 16:5/Heb 13:8
  - c. Daniel spoke of sealed things to come—Dan 12:4, 8-9
  - d. Christ has opened the seals—Rev 5:6-9; 10:2-8; 22:6-10
- 3. A Church centered prophecy: vs 4-11
  - a. What is the Church? —Eph 2:14-19/Gal 6:15-16
  - b. The fallacy of a single *denominational* expression: *The word "church"*
  - c. Bride, virgin, witness, prophets, candlesticks, army, elect, elders, New Jerusalem, saints, seed
- 4. There are four major visions of Christ:
  - a. In the Church—Rev 1:12-13 (Accountability—His/Ours)
  - b. On His Ruling Throne—Rev 5:1-5 (Assurance—Acts 7:56)
  - c. Coming in judgment—Rev 19:11 (Our deliverance—2 Thes 1:7-8)
  - d. Seated with the Father and Spirit
    ("in Edenic glory"—Rev 22:1/Gen 2:8-10)

## 5. The blessing of the Gift: vs 3

- a. The reading—Luke 4:16-17/Neh 8:1-3/1 Tim 4:13
- b. *The hearing*—Neh 8:1-3/Rom 10:17/Mt 13:16-17
- c. *The response*—keep/guard/observe—Ps 119:11/Jude 3

"Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old."  $Mt\ 13:52$ 

The Book of Revelation is the whole bible. From Genesis to The Revelation it is the unfolding of God's glory in Jesus Christ.
